**Will Allen, farmer, founder and CEO of Growing Power, Inc.**

## Growing Power and The Good Food Revolution

Will Allen is an urban farmer who is transforming the planning, cultivation, production and delivery of good, healthy food to urban and rural populations. The son of a southern share-cropper, he was a professional basketball player and then worked for a number of years in corporate sales and marketing at Procter & Gamble.

In 1993 Allen returned to his roots as a farmer to purchase the last remaining registered farm in the City of Milwaukee, where he established and functions as farmer, founder and CEO of the world-preeminent urban farm and nonprofit organization, Growing Power. He is now recognized as a national and international leader in urban and rural agriculture and food policy. Growing Power produces enough produce and fish year-round to feed thousands. Employing young people from the neighboring housing project and community, Growing Power shows how local food systems can help troubled youths, dismantle racism, create jobs, bring urban and rural communities closer together and improve public health. Today his organization helps develop community food systems across the country. In 2008 Allen was a John D. and Katherine T. MacArthur Foundation Fellow and “genius grant” winner. He has been given the National Education Association Security Benefit Corporation Award for Outstanding Service to Public Education in recognition of his work with children, teachers and schools. He continues to do his work out of Growing Power’s national headquarters in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, to bring good food to people all over the world to help end poverty.

## Featured Speakers

**Laura Ten Eyck**

Laura Ten Eyck and her husband, photographer Dietrich Gehring, co-authored “The Hop Growers Handbook: The Essential Guide for Sustainable, Small Scale Production for Home and Market,” published by Chelsea Green Publishing. They operate Indian Ladder Farmstead Cider and Brewery (www.ilfcb.com) with their partner, Stuart Morris. Their commercial hop yard is located on Indian Ladder Farms, an apple orchard and retail market in upstate New York that has been in Ten Eyck’s family for four generations. Her presentations will introduce the botany and history of the hop plant and provide essential information for gardeners and home brewers who want to produce hops for their own use. She will also tell how to scale up to small scale commercial production, including information on planting, cultivation, hop yard construction, harvest, processing and marketing. She will be speaking in the Windsor Tent: **Friday, noon-1 p.m. – Intro to Growing Hops Friday, 4-5 p.m. – Small-scale Hop Growing Saturday, noon-1 p.m. – Intro to Growing Hops Saturday, 2-3 p.m. – Large-scale Hop Growing**

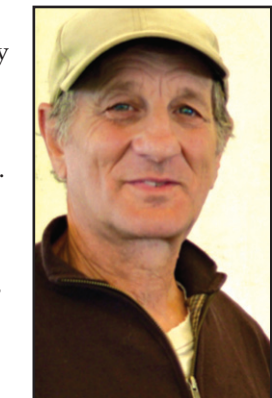

### Forestry as if the Climate (and Future) Mattered

Mitch Lansky is an established author and founder of the Maine Low-Impact Forestry Project. He is facilitating panels on “Forestry as if the Climate (and Future) Mattered” on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The Friday panel, from noon to 1 p.m., includes Ken P. Hotopp and Jamie Simpson. Hotopp is a conservation biologist with studies and interests including old growth forests, native grasslands, wetlands and a range of “critters.” For the past 20 years, his interest has centered on globally-rare snails and questions concerning wildlife ecology. He is a research associate with the Carnegie Museum of Natural History and owns Appalachian Conservation Biology, an environmental consulting company. Jamie Simpson, an environmental lawyer and forester, will speak about the carbon impacts of cutting and burning forest biomass. The discussion will include options for promoting and maintaining carbon-heavy forests. On Saturday from noon to 1 p.m., Lloyd C. Irland and Jamie Simpson will speak on “My Woodlot, Climate Change and My Family Budget: Facing the Tradeoffs.” Irland, president of The Irland Group, regularly contributes to professional and trade publications. The Sunday panel, from noon to 1 p.m., includes Bob Perschel and Lee Burnett. Perschel, executive director of the New England Forestry Foundation, is an environmental professional with 30 years of experience working in forestry, large landscape conservation and wilderness issues. His work focuses on ecological forestry, climate change and sustainable forest biomass utilization. As project director for Forest Works!, Burnett champions the treasures of unbroken woods in a part of the state where the woods are becoming fragmented. He organizes events, writes an e-newsletter, and guides working forest conservation through a regional strategy. He lives in Springvale.
